National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives (NOBLE) We Shall Never Forget... 15th Anniversary of the 9/11 Terrorist Attacks

ALEXANDRIA, VA— *The National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives (NOBLE) National President Perry Tarrant released the following statement on the 15th Anniversary of the September 11th Terrorist Attacks.*

“Fifteen years ago, our nation suffered the worst terrorist attack ever committed on American soil. On September 11, 2001, nearly 3,000 Americans lost their lives in the North and South Towers of the World Trade Center, the Pentagon, and passengers and flight crew members aboard American Airlines Flights 11 and 77 and United Airlines Flights 93 and 175.

“Many NOBLE members in the New York metropolitan area and metro Washington, DC suffered losses of family, friends, and colleagues. I honor each and, every person whose life was lost, including firefighters, police officers and first responders and volunteers who demonstrated bravery and heroism during this tragic event and the cleanup efforts in its aftermath. Moreover, I commend the law enforcement officers who continue to work diligently to prevent future attacks. Their service and hard work are invaluable and greatly appreciated.”
