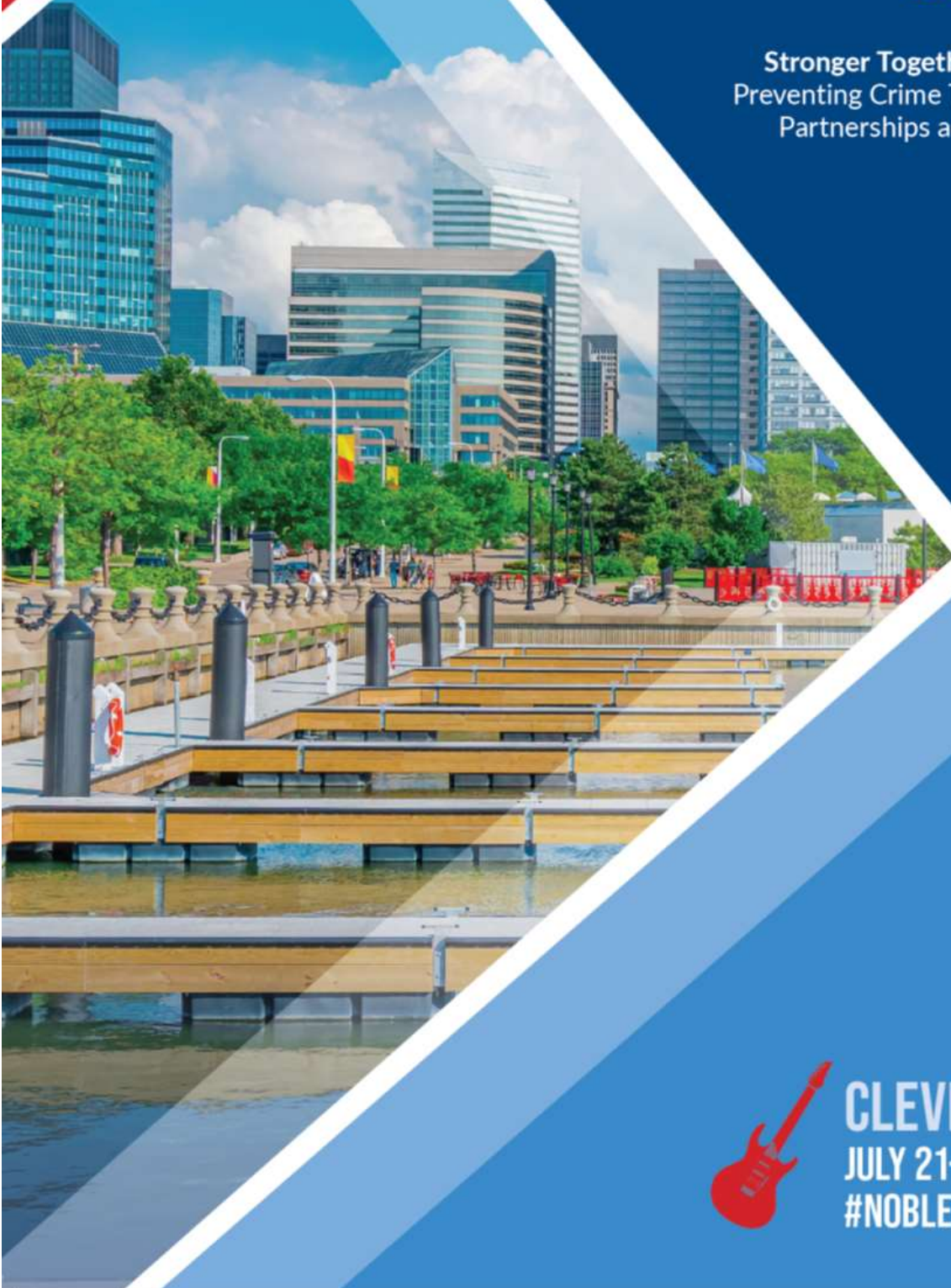

Airport

- **Cleveland Hopkins International Airport (CLE)** - When it opened in 1925, CLE was the first municipal airport in the country. Initially, the airport served as a stop for U.S. Air Mail planes making coast-to-coast flights. It quickly grew to become a major destination for personal and commercial aircraft. CLE also led the nation in implementing new airport technology. This includes the world's first radio-equipped air traffic control tower and the nation's first airfield lighting system. In the 30s and 40s, the airport was a draw to anyone who was anyone in aviation, with both Amelia Earhart and Charles Lindbergh making routine visits. Also, from 1929 until 1949, CLE was the location for the National Air Races.

Today, CLE is Ohio's busiest airport, serving more than 10 million passengers annually. It's positioned within 500 miles of 43 percent of the U.S. population. And for Northeast Ohio travelers, the airport is close—just 12 miles away from downtown Cleveland. Travelers also have the option to take the rail to CLE, a connection that, when added in 1968, was another first in the country.

- **Shuttles, Limos, and Ride Shares:**
 - There are numerous limousine companies and hotels that provide service to travelers at CLE. All limousine service must be arranged in advance.
 - Ground Transportation Office: 216-265-6794, Monday - Friday: 9:00am – 3pm, Saturday & Sunday (CLOSED).
 - Ride Shares - Ride Share pick-up and drop-off can be coordinated on either the upper (departures) or lower (arrivals) roadways. Authorized Ride Share Companies: Lyft <https://www.lyft.com/>, Uber <https://www.uber.com/>.
- **Taxis:**
 - For passengers leaving the airport, CLE offers a dedicated taxicab service. Our fleet of white, CLE Airport Taxis consists of 110 vehicles with GPS technology, in-cab camera's, a pre-set rate structure, and

drivers who receive enhanced customer service training. Three companies jointly operate this outbound service: Ace Taxi, Americab, and ABC Taxi.

- To use the taxi service, look for the taxi entrance, located at the south end on the Baggage Claim level (carousel #11). Pickups are made in this area only. Taxicab drop-offs can be made anywhere on the Airport campus. Taxicab service is available twenty four hours a day, seven days a week. Anyone who may need taxicab service after normal business hours (5:00 am - 11:00 pm) will need to contact one of the taxicab companies directly. Credit cards are accepted by all taxi's.

- **Rental Cars:**

- CLE has a consolidated rental car facility located off the airport grounds. Shuttle service is available for all rental car customers from the main terminal to the rental car facility. The rental car shuttle departs from the rental car shuttle terminal, located at the Ground Transportation Center (GTC). The GTC is located at the north end of the terminal on baggage level. Travelers can utilize the 2 banks of elevators across from the welcome center or escalators by claim 9 and claim 3 to access the baggage claim level. For travelers needing assistance, a telephone center with rental car information is located at the info counter at Baggage Claim.
- The shuttle bus ride from the terminal to the rental car facility takes approximately 5-7 minutes. The shuttle buses run continuously 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.
- The rental car facility is located at: 19601 Maplewood Avenue, Cleveland, OH 44135

NOBLE Conference Shuttle Service – There will be shuttle services provided from all four hotels (Hilton, Marriott, Westin, and Drury) to the convention center. Please note that all four hotels are within walking distance to the convention center.

The Huntington Convention Center of Cleveland

Managed by ASM Global, the Huntington Convention Center of Cleveland provides over 475,000 square feet of prime meeting and event space, which includes 225,000 sq. ft of Exhibit Hall space, two ballrooms, and 50+ breakout rooms. Our Center is connected to the 600-room Hilton Cleveland Downtown and Cleveland Public Auditorium and Conference Center which features a 10,000 seat stadium-style auditorium.

Located in the heart of downtown Cleveland, our connected convention center campus is a convenient location to host anything from small executive meetings to large industry tradeshows. Our Center is located within walking distance of exceptional restaurants, art galleries, theaters, entertainment districts, professional sports venues, and nearly 5,000 hotel rooms.

Amenities include ATMs, free Wi-Fi in pre-function areas, Starbucks, Ninja City, mother's lounges, and the UPS store. Conference Registration

All delegates and conference registrants are required to register at the Huntington Convention Center of Cleveland – Exhibit Hall C. Once there, you will be asked to present a form of personal identification (driver license) or scan your registration confirmation to receive a registration badge, tickets, and conference materials. This credential must be worn at all times to gain access to workshops, meal events, and evening functions. The following meal events require a ticket to enter: Civil Rights Brunch, Host City Reception, Awards Luncheon, Women's Symposium, and Annual Awards Banquet.
